

**A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF CENTRAL BUTTE IN RESPECT TO  
REGULATING BILLBOARDS LOCATED WITHIN SIGN CORRIDORS  
ADMINISTERED BY THE TOWN OF CENTRAL BUTTE.**

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**The Council of the Town of Central Butte in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:**

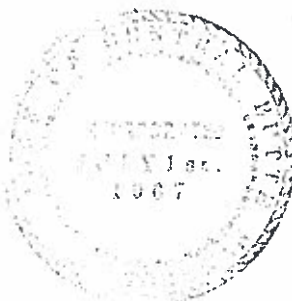
- 1. All applications to place a sign in the sign corridor shall be in form "A".**
- 2. Approval to establish a sign in the sign corridor shall be issued in form "B".**
- 3. Signs situated in the sign corridor shall be subject to the following regulations:**
  - a) The applicant is responsible for any alterations to telephone or power lines or other utilities made necessary by the work authorized in the permit.**
  - b) Erection of the sign shall be made within six calendar months of the date of the permit.**
  - c) Signs must be 4 ft. x 8 ft. (32 sq. ft) in size.**
  - d) Signs must be professionally painted or have graphic lettering applied to it's surface.**
  - e) Signs to be placed 118 ft. apart and 72 ft. from the centre line of the adjacent highway.**
  - f) When the sign is in need of repair the Town will send a letter to the owner and if no action is taken within a month by the individual or corporation to remedy their sign, the town will remove the sign from the corridor.**
  - g) The corridor adjacent to highway no. 42 shall begin at the most westerly point and continue east and the corridor adjacent to highway No. 19 shall begin at the most northerly end and proceed south.**

**This Bylaw shall come into force and take effect upon the date of final passing.**

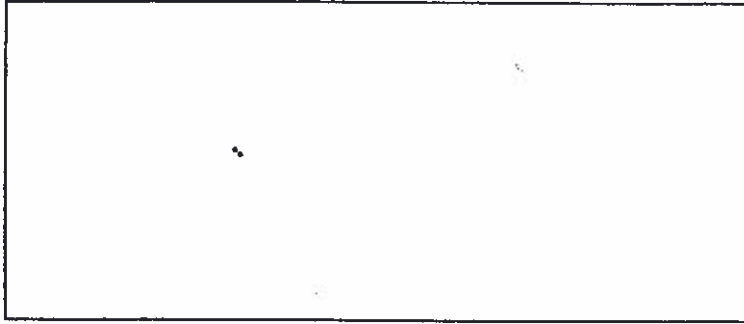

**Sign Corridor Permit**

to erect a sign in the Central Butte sign corridor subject to the following conditions:

- 1) The applicant is responsible for any alteration to telephone or power lines or other utilities made necessary by work authorized by this permit.
- 2) Erection of the sign must be made within 6 calendar months of the date of this permit.
- 3) The sign **MUST** be professionally painted or have graphic lettering applied to it's surface.
- 4) The surface of the sign must be 4ft x 8 ft.
- 5) The sign must not be placed adjacent to a provincial highway on any horizontal curve where an advisory speed has been posted.
- 6) The sign must be painted on the back or covered with a neutral color.
- 7) Signs must be placed 118 ft. apart and 72 ft from the center line of the adjacent highway.
